#### **REF: Consultation on the possible closure of Great Creaton Primary School**

As you may be aware, on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> March, the Cabinet of Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) made a decision to begin a period of consultation on the possible closure of Great Creaton Primary School.

The purpose of this correspondence is to outline the reasons behind the decision to begin consultation on the possible closure of the school, provide further details regarding the statutory process involved and timelines for any future decisions. This correspondence will also identify the manner in which any stakeholder may make their views known to NCC on the proposal.

This is the beginning of an initial period of consultation on the possible closure of Great Creaton Primary School, and no decision on the school's future has been made at the current time.

NCC would like to invite all stakeholders to make their views known on the proposal and to ensure that all points of view are given full consideration during the consultation and future decision-making processes.

## Why are NCC consulting on the possible closure of the school?

The low number of pupils on roll at the school, and the challenges this represents to the school, has been a cause for concern for both NCC and the school itself for a number of years. It is for this reason and those outlined below that the Chair of Governors wrote to

NCC on the 6<sup>th</sup> February stating that in their opinion the school was no longer viable and requesting that NCC begin consultation on the possible closure of the school.

- The school has a maximum capacity of 84 pupils. At the time of writing, there are
  just 28 pupils on the school roll. This number is likely to fall to 23 from September
  2018, once the current Year 6 cohort of 10 pupils leaves the school. Over 72% of
  the school's total capacity will be available as surplus from September;
- Pupil projection forecasts, compiled by NCC and analysis of other demographic factors, such as planned housing development in the area, do not indicate this trend will change;
- At the time of writing, 7 pupils residing in the village of Creaton attend Great Creaton Primary School. The school can no longer be considered to be primarily serving the community it was originally intended to serve;
- The school's most recent Ofsted inspection (Jan 2018) placed the school into the 'Requires Improvement' category for the third time in succession;
- The small number of pupils on roll at the school mean it is very difficult for the school to achieve pupil outcomes in line with the expected national standard;
- Having less than 30 pupils on roll throughout the entire school could dictate that the all pupils at the school, from Reception to Year 6, are taught in a single class. This poses significant challenges in terms of effective curriculum delivery and the outcomes achieved by all pupils at the school;
- Such low pupil numbers means the school will struggle to fund sufficient experienced and capable staff for the following management and support roles; SENCO, subject leadership, safeguarding and the supporting of vulnerable pupils.

## What happens next?

Any Local Authority that proposes to close a school is required to follow a statutory process that is enshrined in legislation and defined by the Department for Education (DfE). This process with dates for the Great Creaton consultation is set out below. The NCC decision making process which facilitates this process is also identified (in bold);
